Children's Church

We have had a wonderful few weeks of learning together and the Thanksgiving and Advent season seemed to fly by! The Sunday before Thanksgiving we had a special lesson on thanking God for all He does for us. Our memory verse for this lesson was Psalm 136:1-"Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good. His love endures forever." To start us off we played a quick gratitude game. I set the timer for 3 minutes and asked the kids to look around the room and say things they are grateful for. I loved hearing what the kids thought of. One girl said the window which brightens the room, another child mentioned the books that are in the classroom, while another mentioned the television that Pastor Rod got for us for our Bible videos. This was a good lesson that when we pay attention we can find things to be grateful for! We also played a fun game called Turkey Waddle Relay. I divided up the groups into two teams and they had

to walk to one side of the room and back holding a balloon between their ankles before passing it to the next person. This brought a lot of laughs! Our lesson focused on giving thanks to God in all circumstances.

Our Advent series this year was called: Journey to Bethlehem. Our first lesson was on Joseph and how he had to learn to trust God during a time of uncertainty and fear. Joseph was nervous when the angel visited him and told him that he would be a father! Our memory verse was Luke 2:10-11, "But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." We played some fun Christmas games with this lesson. One was Christmas Charades where the kids had to act out something Christmas related (example. drinking hot cocoa) and

we had to guess what it was! Another game we played was called Name that toon. One of us would say a line in a Christmas song and we had to guess which song it was!

Another one of our Advent lessons was on The Magi (Wisemen) who visited Jesus. We talked about how The Magi were looking for a sign and then they saw the Christmas star and knew they wanted to see Jesus and bring Him gifts! We also talked about how Jesus is the greatest gift of all and we can share the love of Jesus with others through our actions. On this specific Sunday we had an extra special game time because Adger Oakley made his own game to share with us! Adger even brought pieces from one of his games at home so that each of the children could play. They loved it and I love seeing how creative the kids are. I hope that Children's Church can always be an environment that the kids can share their ideas!








Nursery
